# Freshmen Applications



**February** : Applications to all feeder schools

**March** : Applications Due

**April** : ASB Presidents interview all students (All make it if they complete the application) Average of 75 Freshman Leadership Students

**May**: Freshmen ASB orientation the first Saturday in May. Teach them the culture and ASB expectations.

**August**: Participate in activities that help them get to know each other. Presidents are chosen in the leadership classes.

# Freshman Application Requirements

## WSB Requirements to be in the class

### Requirements:

1. Must have a 2.5 overall GPA or higher.
2. May have no more than two "N" and no U's within the last report card (1st semester)
3. Must have no discipline (example: disruption in class, fighting) within this school year. Smaller issues such as tardies, dress code and cell phones will be handled on a case by case basis. If it is a habitual problem than you will be screened out.
4. Must be scheduled for the WSB class next year.

**Application to be completed on a separate sheet of paper  
Must be typed and no more than one sheet of paper  
(Failure to follow instructions will result in your application being removed)**

A. Put your name, grade, school, phone number and email in the upper right corner

B. Questions

1. Why should we select you to be a member of WSB?
2. Describe a typical weekend
3. What is the worst thing that you have done in your years of school?
4. What is the kindest thing that you have done in your years of school?
5. Tell us about your best friend.
6. Give me five words that your friends would use to describe you.
7. In twenty five words tell us who your role model is and why?

# Presidents, Officers and Commissioners, “Oh My”

Juniors shadow Seniors in all areas

**January**- we meet with all juniors interested in running for

**February** - Applications to be a class president are due.



We have three student body Presidents and three class presidents.

**February 28**- Elections for President. Losing group gets to pick what commissioner position. Keep those that lose close to you. Keep them enthused.

**March**- We interview students who are interested in being commissioners and assign them a group

# Preparing for the new year:

**April**- we take the three presidents to breakfast and review with each of them what our expectations are. We discuss campaign promises and set goals with them

**May**- ASB Presidents meet with the freshmen and teach them the WOLFPACK Way

ASB Presidents meet with group leaders (Commissioners) Juniors and Seniors and review all that is expected

**June**- ASB President's plan the ASB retreat (three days of bonding and reflecting). Only presidents and group leaders

**July**- ASB Presidents along with one advisor meet with all members of the group. We review expectations and they set goals. That is how their grade will be determined. Work in summer=less work the remainder of the year.

- Each President is assigned to work with two groups
- They meet with those groups often and work side by side with the commissioner
- Every commissioner gives a report on what their group is doing at the Monday Executive Board Meeting
- Every Nine weeks the commissioners and designated President evaluates the students in their group.
- The advisors follow up with each evaluation
